Headings for Readings

First Reading (Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48) This tells how Cornelius, a Roman Centurion, became the first pagan to receive the grace of Baptism. It shows that God is not selective in his love. His salvation is offered to all.

Second Reading (1 John 4:7-10) This contains what is probably the most important statement ever made about God, namely, that he is love.

Gospel (John 15:9-17) Jesus is talking to his friends the night before he died. He leaves them his supreme commandment: "Love one another, as I have loved you".
