Seeing your Life through the Lens of the Gospel (Mark 4:26-34)

If you sow seeds, or watch plants grow, you have ample opportunities to pause in wonder at the whole process of growth. It takes place imperceptibly and comes to fruition in beautiful flowers, majestic trees and abundant harvests. As we come out of the Coronavirus lockdown you may have had the opportunity to rejoice at the renewal of social life.

Jesus uses this as a parable about the growth of the Kingdom of God, the kingdom of right relationships with God and with one another.

There too growth is slow, development is imperceptible, and then without realising it you have a mature relationship. Recall the stages of such development in your life and give thanks.

In the second parable Jesus invites us to reflect on the importance and significance of relationships in our lives as they grow and mature. This is true both of our relationship with God and with others around us. When have you found a relationship in which you could 'make a nest in its shade'? **John Byrne OSA**

Colmcille 1500

St. Colmcille, also known as St. Columba, is one of Ireland's patron saints, a distinction that he shares with St. Patrick and St. Bridget. St. Colmcille was born in Gartán, County Donegal on December 7, 521 A.D. In 545 A.D., St. Colmcille founded his first monastery in Derry / Doire Cholm Cille. St. Colmcille and twelve monks sailed from Derry to the island of Iona in Scotland in 563 A.D. He died on Iona on June 9, 597 A.D. and his feast day is commemorated on that date every year.

With this year marking the 1500th anniversary of the birth of Colmcille, a new website has been set up which will promote all of the celebrations taking place as part of the historic occasion.

The website will be a central hub for people in the North West to collectively promote activities and events for the 1500th anniversary, while also providing a collaborative platform to engage with national and international audiences and to share other events taking place elsewhere marking the importance and legacy of the 6th century saint in the North West and around the world.

The programme covers a range of projects, events and activities including a community grants scheme. It is being delivered in partnership with a range of local, regional, national and international organisations and builds on an Audit of Columban Heritage undertaken in 2018, aiming to raise knowledge and understanding of Colmcille as well as establishing a lasting legacy.
