Coming to Church Guidelines

Information for all coming to our Churches

We ask that you observe the following:

- ◊ Please wear a mask
- ◊ Hand Sanitiser to be used upon entry and exit
- ◊ Social Distancing - stay 2 metres apart
- ◊ Avoid touching any surface
- ◊ Enter pews via the side aisles and then move towards the centre aisle
- ◊ Please go to end of seat so as to avoid others having to pass you. When in seat make sure you move to the side (or centre depending on grouping) so as to let others know there is available seating
- ◊ Holy Communion directly on hand only. (no gloves or tissues please)
- ◊ If you wish to light a candle, please bring your own lighter
- ◊ **Weddings & Funerals: 50 people allowed to attend, this numbers applies at graveside also**
- ◊ No congregating outside church
- ◊ The Sunday obligation remains suspended, thus people should consider joining a weekday mass

Pathways

A basic Adult Faith course, Pathways, is offered over
nine Saturdays per year for two years. It has no
educational prerequisites and no written work attached
but provides a good basis for people resuming faith
formation, perhaps years after leaving school. Also
offering a follow-on to Pathways, the Certificate in
Christian Thought which is offered in collaboration with
St Mary's University College, Belfast, who validate it.
Both of these courses will be offered in-house (Covid
permitting) and via Zoom. In this way the hope is they
may be accessible to people living a distance away.

The Certificate in Christian Thought is a two-year
course, delivered over 7 days per year with the option of
doing the course solely for further personal development
or also for validation by St Mary's, this option involving
a small amount of written work.

Also offered is the Diploma in Pastoral Theology in
collaboration with St Patrick's Pontifical University,
Maynooth. This is delivered over two years and includes
3 x Saturday-Sunday weekends in-house and 18 x 2 hour
evening sessions via Zoom per year. Students are
required to have a pastoral placement in parishes in
order to gain or increase their pastoral experience.
