Statement by Bishop Alan McGuckian SJ on recent Government Guidelines

Postponement of Sacraments

*It is with a heavy heart that I have to inform
priests, young people and their families and
the staff in our schools of the need to postpone
our Confirmations yet again.*

*The government, at very short notice, has
declared that Confirmations and First Holy
Communions 'are off'. I know that all of our
schools and parishes were making preparations
to have small ceremonies in complete
compliance with the Covid 19 guidelines.
The Government have made it clear that
NPHEP have called for this deferment as a
result of the rising threat from the very
contagious Delta variant. This sudden
decision will be a cause of deep disappointment
to all those involved. Again I am very sorry
that we need to comply with this decision
and I recognise the great inconvenience this
causes to so many people.*

Coming to Church Guidelines

Information for all coming to our Churches

We ask that you observe the following:

- ◇ Please wear a mask
- ◇ Hand Sanitiser to be used upon entry and exit
- ◇ Social Distancing - stay 2 metres apart
- ◇ Avoid touching any surface
- ◇ Enter pews via the side aisles and then move
towards the centre aisle
- Please go to end of seat so as to avoid others
having to pass you. When in seat make sure
you move to the side (or centre depending on
grouping) so as to let others know there is
available seating**
- ◇ Holy Communion directly on hand only.
(no gloves or tissues please)
- ◇ If you wish to light a candle, please bring your
own lighter
- ◇ **Weddings & Funerals: 50 people allowed to
attend, this numbers applies at graveside also**
- ◇ No congregating outside church
- ◇ The Sunday obligation remains suspended,
thus people should consider joining a weekday
mass

Seeing your Life through the Lens of the Gospel (Mark 6:1-6)

Personal prejudices and agendas can
block us from listening to the what
another person has to say.

Who do they think they are?

Perhaps you have experienced this.
What difference has it made to you when
you were able to focus on the content of
what was being said and leave to one side
your own prejudices about the speaker?

It has been said that there is nothing as
useless as the right advice at the wrong time.
We may want to reach out to another but
may be unable to because at that moment
the other person is not ready to be helped.
Like Jesus we can 'do no deed of power'.
As Jesus had to be patient and wait
for another opportunity, so do we.
What have you learned about the importance
of patience in working with others?

Religion easily brings up prejudices.
Some dismiss religion as superstition, old
hat, or based on an outdated world view.
Even among believers, prejudice can make
it hard for individuals to listen to an
alternative way of looking at things, to
consider a different way of celebrating liturgy,
or to live at peace with difference. Yet a closed
mind can lead to a stagnant faith. When have
you found that a willingness to consider a
different perspective led to a deepening
and strengthening of your faith?
